Princeton Review Ranks Loyola Law School in Top 10 for Classroom Experience, Teaching, Diversity

LOS ANGELES – Loyola Law School, Los Angeles was ranked seventh for “Best Professors” in the 2012 edition of the Princeton Review's *Best 167 Law Schools*. Loyola ranked seventh for “Best Environment for Minority Students.” And the Law School ranked ninth for “Best Classroom Experience.” Loyola has been ranked in the top 10 for “Best Classroom Experience” and “Best Professors” since 2008.

The profile praises Loyola’s curriculum as having “a strong foundation in legal theory but also the practical skills necessary to excel in the workplace” as evidenced in part by “a tremendous trial advocacy program, moot court and three law reviews.” The write-up also identified Loyola as having a “broad range of specialists in a variety of fields,” and noted that professors “set the bar high, but give you all of the tools to use at your discretion to meet that bar.”

Campus life received high marks in the review, which noted the school’s proximity to the heart of downtown Los Angeles and the continuous shuttle delivering students to it. “Courts, law firms and our city’s phenomenal entertainment are basically our campus,” said one student in the review. Moreover, “alumni networking opportunities are strong.”

The rankings are based on institutional data from the schools and on surveys of 18,000 students attending the schools profiled. The survey asked students questions about themselves, their career plans and their school’s academics, student body and campus life.
