

LOYOLA LAW SCHOOL, BEIJING SUMMER PROGRAM TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AND INTERNSHIP STIPENDS

We are very pleased to announce the availability this summer of two tuition scholarships and two internship stipends in connection with the Beijing summer program that is jointly administered by Loyola Law School and Brooklyn Law School. In accordance with the wishes of the donor, the scholarships and stipends are only available to current students of Loyola Law School.

These grants are generously provided by the Eleven Twenty Seven Foundation and administered by the USA China Law Group.

TUITION SCHOLARSHIP

Two tuition scholarships are available for a maximum grant of \$2,100 each (assuming the student enrolls for three units of coursework at \$700 per unit; student who take fewer units will receive a smaller award). Decisions will be based on the student's qualifications and the strength of the application.

Only current Loyola Law School (Los Angeles) students who have been accepted to the Beijing summer program and who have paid the \$400 tuition deposit are eligible. Those students who receive the scholarship will have their tuition paid directly to the law school and their deposit will be refunded.

Application Deadline: Monday, March 1, 2010 at 5:00 p.m.

Please provide the following information in your application. If the requested information is contained in your resume (see below), you do not need to repeat it in the application.

- Your name and contact information
- Your undergraduate *alma mater* and "major" course of study
- Your current year at Loyola Law School
- Whether you are a day or evening student
- The organizations or publications you are involved with as a law student. You may also list organizations you were involved with for your undergraduate degree (and graduate, where applicable)
- Any academic honors or awards you earned as a law student (or as an undergraduate or graduate student, where applicable)
- Your volunteer experience as a law student (also as an undergraduate or graduate student, where applicable)
- Any professional experience after undergraduate school (if applicable)
- Two or three paragraphs [250 word limit] on why you should receive this scholarship, including international experience and interest, interest in international or comparative law, and any additional information you believe is relevant.

INTERNSHIP STIPEND

Two internship stipends are also available in the amount of \$2,000 each. The purpose of the stipend is to help students who wish to stay in Beijing (or elsewhere in China) for an internship opportunity. It is the responsibility of students to find their own non-paid internship. The internship must be at a non-profit or non-governmental organization doing legal work in China, and the internship must be physically done in China. The internship must be for at least 4 weeks during the summer of 2010, following the Loyola summer abroad program.

Decisions will be based on the student's qualifications and the strength of the application.

Only current Loyola Law School (Los Angeles) students who have been accepted to the Beijing summer program and who have paid the \$400 tuition deposit are eligible.

Those students who receive the stipend will receive half of the stipend amount immediately. The other half will be disbursed after the student has finished the internship and presents a written report on his or her experience.

Application Deadline: As soon as the student has a complete application

You must provide the following information and documentation in your application.

- Your name and contact information
- A current resume
- A letter from the sponsoring organization on official letterhead (not faxed or emailed) inviting you to be an intern for at least 4 weeks this summer. The letter should also specify that you are not being compensated for your work.
- Two or three paragraphs [250 word limit] on what you hope to accomplish during your internship, as well as commenting on your international experience and interest, interest in international or comparative law, and any additional information you believe is relevant.

A scan or jpg of the letter from the sponsoring organization is acceptable with the application, but you will have to provide an original of the letter, on letterhead, for funds to be disbursed.
