WORKS IN PROGRESS

Human Welfare (accepted to SEALS W-I-P series)

This project uses an evolutionary approach and data collected during the COVID-19 pandemic to argue that the COVID-19 pandemic reveals a different pandemic—one that has as a causal element the poor functioning of the administrative state. It develops a new approach for evaluating the merits of administrative and legislative action called "human welfare" and explains how it offers a novel and valuable framework that may have advantages over the commonly used public interest and public choice approaches.

Understanding Incest Prohibitions

This project develops the hypothesis that, contrary to the thinking of legal scholars and sociologists, laws prohibiting close inbreeding do indeed have their origins in human biology. The theoretical framework it reveals may have broad application to law generally.

An Evolutionary Hypothesis of Property This project considers the law of property from an evolutionary perspective.

The Virtue of Intellectual Property

Traditional understandings of intellectual property law argue that intellectual property rights are explained by the demands of natural rights theories and/or the demands of utilitarianism. This project argues that these views misunderstand the basic reasons why humans prefer intellectual property protections, and develops the novel hypothesis that laws protecting rights in intellectual goods find explanation in human adaptive preferences.
